

March 2017 Update

The following table outlines the destinations of Year 11 pupils from 2014, with comparison to average of all schools in County Durham. The column highlighted green is Bishop Barrington destination data (Y11 cohort 2014) which is published by the DFE. The 2017 DFE data is based on the retention (or otherwise) of pupils after at least two full terms of leaving Bishop Barrington.

The data reported for 2015 and 2016 is from the Local Authority's Activity Survey Reports:

KEY POINTS FROM OUR POST-16 DATA

- 1. The participation rate in "All Learning" (and elements within) has increased; and was higher than the county average in 2015.**
- 2. The percentage of pupils accessing apprenticeships (Level 2 and 3) was higher than the county average in 2015.**
- 3. The amount of pupils who are not in education, employment or training has decreased significantly over 3 years - a decrease of 9.4% compared to the 2014 cohort. In 2015 the percentage is lower than the county average.**
