

September 2017 Update

The following table outlines the destinations of Year 11 pupils from 2014, with comparison to average of all schools in County Durham and to national benchmarks.

The data reported for 2014 cohort is from the Local Authority's Activity Survey Report (Jan 2017).

The 2015 cohort data is published by the Department for Education and is based on the retention (or otherwise) of cohort 2015, near completion of Y13.

Only the NEET data for the 2016 cohort has been published by the Local authority (March 2017).

2017 cohort data is based on school tracking of applications and offers of placements to all pupils. The NEET County figure is based on percentage of 16 year olds who are NEET in April 2017.

KEY POINTS FROM OUR POST-16 DATA

- 1. The participation rate in "All Learning" is increasing.**
- 2. The percentage of pupils accessing apprenticeships has decreased.**
- 3. The amount of pupils who are not in education, employment or training is decreasing. For cohort 2016, local authority activity survey indicates a significant decrease for pupils nearing the end of Y12. 100% of cohort 2017 has been offered a place at full time post-16 learning.**
